CLASS DESCRIPTION

KANSAS MINIMUM STANDARDS - Bill Haverkamp

This class is the review of the Kansas Minimum Standards. The class will be conducted as an "open forum," providing attendees the opportunity to ask questions.

This course will provide two PDHs toward the education requirement of KAR 66-14-1.

John Calhoun - Steve Brosemer

John Calhoun, Surveyor General of Kansas and Nebraska, circa 1858. Surveyor General Calhoun will discuss the progress of surveys and the deputy surveyors in the Territory, interwoven with the political intrigue known as "Bleeding Kansas."

HubTack - Andy Parker

Understand HubTack. How we process updates, tips and tricks on using the HubTack System, as well as the future direction. We hope to be demonstrating the new user interface, which will also bring some new features.

Survey Evidence and Procedure - Jeff Lucas

There is a line of thinking inside and outside the surveying community that goes something like this:

The surveyor's only role is to deal with the facts as contained in the client's deed; all other issues with regard to boundaries can only be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction. The obvious problem with this line of thinking is that if this is truly the case, society does not need land surveyors.

Boundary determinations boil down to two questions: A question of law and a question of fact. "The question of what is a boundary line is a matter of law, but the question of where a boundary line, or a corner, is actually located is a question of fact." Walleigh v. Emery, (PA.Super.Court. 1960). This seminar will explore both of the questions fully, as well as the topics of evidence and procedures for the determination of a well-reasoned opinion on boundaries. State-specific law will be incorporated into this seminar in the process of answering these and many other questions. PowerPoint presentation.

Retracement and the 2009 Manual - Jeff Lucas

Is the Manual relevant to your practice? Perhaps we will answer that question once and for all. The "next edition" of the Manual is out; that is, the Manual of Surveying Instructions 2009 (2009 Manual), which effectively replaces the previous 1973 edition of the Manual. This seminar will explore those chapters that are most relevant to the land surveyor in private practice who must deal with the system of rectangular surveys, most commonly referred to as the Public Land Survey System (PLSS). The 2009 Manual gives expanded treatment of the duties and responsibilities of the local surveyor who was to subdivide the sections into their aliquot parts and the good faith efforts of the original entryman in finding his claim on the ground. The new Manual also corrects over 100 years of misinterpretation of the evidence standards applicable to corners within the system, but does it also introduce new confusion? Original surveys and retracement surveys will be discussed under the instructions of the Manual. PowerPoint presentation.

Bill has been in the surveying profession since 1977, beginning as an entry-level survey team member on a Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) preliminary design survey crew. Upon licensure in 1986, Bill was promoted to a Crew Chief position, then in 1990 to the Survey Coordinator position for the Agency, managing KDOT and consultant survey resources for engineering survey and land surveying projects. He has presented numerous continuing education courses relative to KDOT Survey Practice, Route Surveying, Research Methods and Kansas Minimum Standards. Bill retired from KDOT in the spring of 2017. A member of KSLS since 1978, Bill has served terms as a Director, President, and Past President. In July, 2016 he was appointed as a Land Survey Member to the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions.




